2 Who are we?

MISSION

Through its Centre for Research and Expertise in Social Gerontology (CREGÉS), the Integrated Health and Social Services University Network (CIUSSS) for West-Central Montreal was designated as a University-Affiliated Centre (UAC) in social gerontology. The CREGÉS is funded by the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux (MSSS) and the Fonds de recherche du Québec – Société et Culture (FRQSC) under the infrastructure support program for university research centres and institutes.

The CREGÉS is a research infrastructure that facilitates the sharing of knowledge and expertise between academic and practice settings. Its mission is based on developing social research; establishing, testing and validating innovative and leading practices; educating; and enabling knowledge transfer and mobilization.

To fulfill this mission, the CREGÉS counts on the participation and support of university and institutional researchers, research practitioners and students, as well as collaborators from various practice settings and partner organizations. The latter are supported by a team of professionals who coordinate CREGÉS activities, carry out evaluative research and studies, and oversee a knowledge transfer and mobilization program.

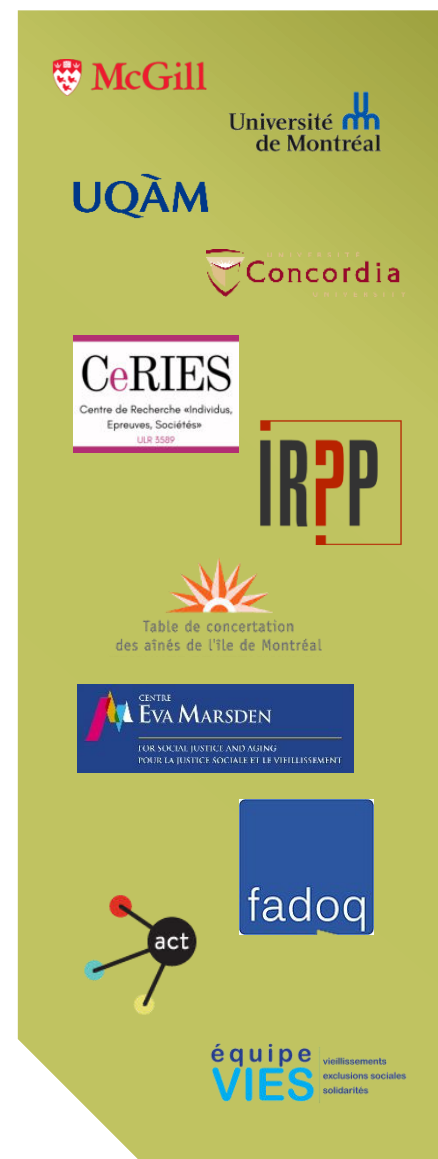

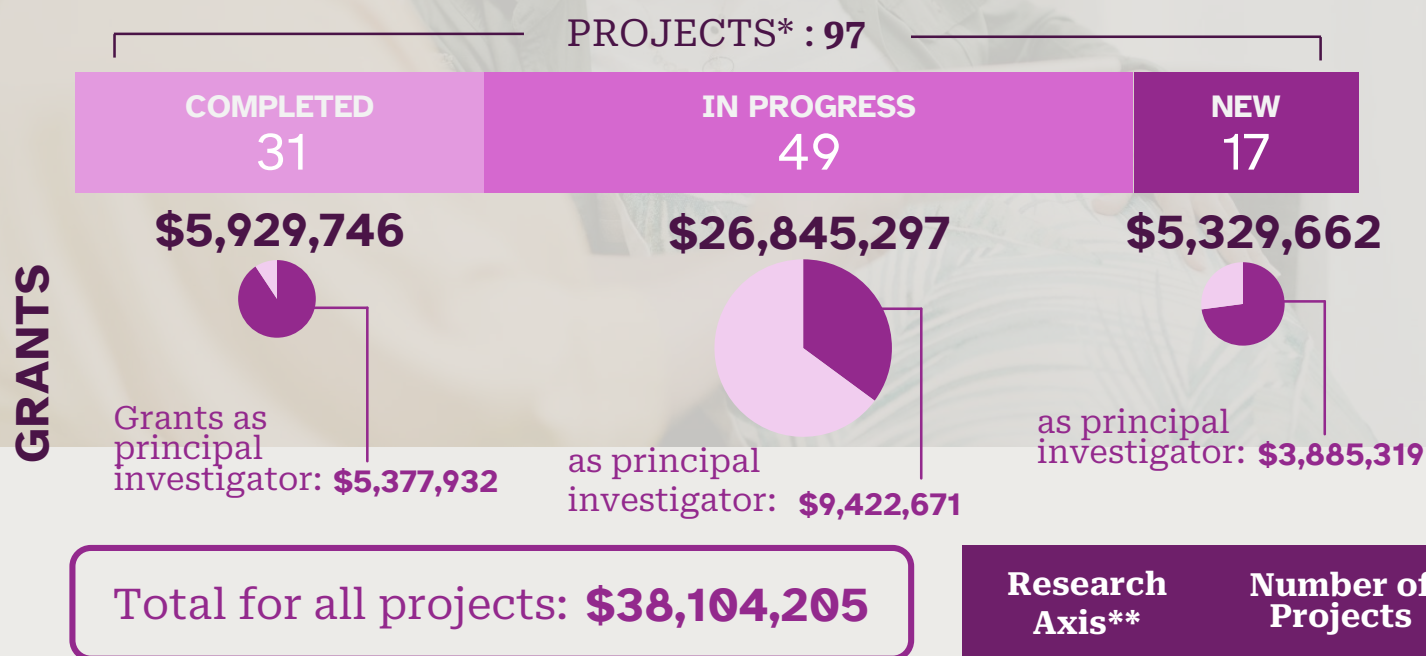

3.2 Research Axes

Research at the CREGÉS is centred on social gerontology, a field that covers the social, cultural, political and economic aspects of old age and aging — complex phenomena which affect a population that is by no means homogenous. In keeping with our aim to gather knowledge and present a multifaceted vision of this population's diversified experience, our research program is organized around five axes.

Axis 1: Seniors as Social Actors

Research in this axis focuses on how resilience and well-being among older adults can be fostered by building their capacities. Seniors are not seen as a clientele to be served, but rather as active participants in the aging process.

Axis 3: Service Delivery to Seniors and Their Loved Ones

This research axis helps develop innovative modes of service delivery aimed at better supporting and evaluating current practices. Areas of focus include mistreatment, mental health issues, chronic diseases, cognitive aging and palliative care. Services should target not only clinical recovery, but also adaptation, integration and the increased participation of older adults.

Transversal Axis: Public Policy in Social Gerontology

This research axis looks at public policy development and knowledge dissemination with a view to contributing to public debates in social gerontology. Projects examine the scope, application, independence and sustainability of social gerontology policies, themselves often influenced by an array of political and socioeconomic factors — for example, the power of the groups that represent older adults, class differences, government fiscal capacity or the long-term structural impacts of policy decisions.

Axis 2: Heterogeneity of Aging: Bodies, Identity and Society

This research axis aims to put aging stereotypes into perspective; examine the multiple ways in which people experience and perceive aging; and explore the many ties between age and living environments.

Axis 4: Living Environments

This research axis critically examines the idealized “home environment” in light of the interpersonal dynamics and rules & regulations in different living environments. The goal is to understand how experiences and perceptions of aging are affected not only by the physical structures in which older adults live, but also by interpersonal exchanges and personal care.

3.3 Support for Research Activities

3.3.1 Scientific Committee

To encourage the next generation of social gerontology researchers, each year the CREGÉS's Scientific Committee organizes competitions, examines applications, issues seed funding to new projects, and financially supports the dissemination and sharing of research findings. It also provides scholarships to students who are supervised by regular CREGÉS researchers.

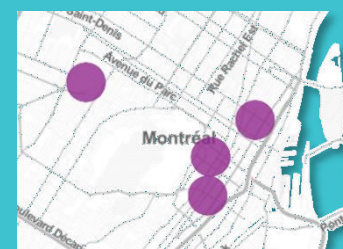
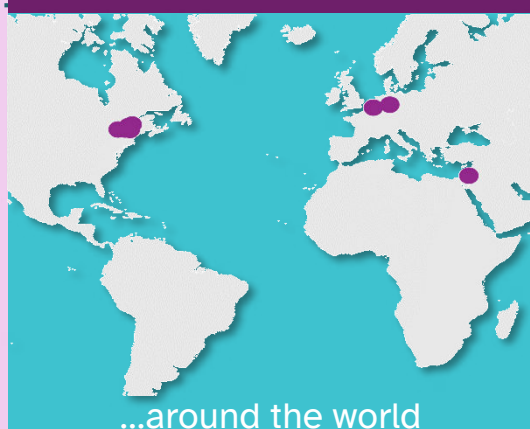

4 Domains of Expertise

The CREGÉS's four Domains of Expertise are composed of coordinators, researchers and professionals who work together to develop and implement innovative & leading practices as well as knowledge transfer & mobilization and outreach activities. They also contribute to research and knowledge development.



Inclusive Aging, Diversity, Health and Well-Being (IDSB)

The Domain of Expertise IDSB aims to improve clinical and community practices to enhance the health and well-being of older adults by adopting an inclusive approach that respects the diverse experience of aging.



Caregiving

For 30 years now, the Domain of Expertise in Caregiving has set out to recognize and respond to the diverse nature of caregiving as well as the differing psychosocial and practical needs of informal or family caregivers.



Counter Mistreatment of Older Adults

Formed in 1980, the Domain of Expertise to Counter Mistreatment of Older Adults strives to meet the needs of psychosocial workers and members of the general public who are confronted with situations of mistreatment.



Palliative Care

These mandates give concrete form to the commitments undertaken as part of the action plans to improve the living situation of seniors.

Countering Mistreatment

Since the launch of the first government action plan to combat elder abuse (2010-2015), after which came two subsequent versions (2017-2022 and 2022-2027), the CREGÉS's Domain of Expertise to Counter Mistreatment of Older Adults has worked closely with the MSSS to implement the adopted measures. Key milestones under this year's three ongoing mandates include:

- › Completing the health & social services network (RSSS) policy compliance assessments
- › Developing and adding online training for psychosocial practitioners, clinical supervisors and service providers
- › Developing and launching four online training modules along with a learning guide on material and financial mistreatment, aimed at financial sector employees and made available on the Elder Mistreatment Hotline (Ligne Aide Abus Aînés – LAAA) website





Inclusive Aging, Diversity, Health and Well-Being (IDSB)

As part of the 2022-2027 government action plan to counter elder mistreatment, the IDSB team continued developing training on the realities of elder LGBTQ+ people with dementia, in palliative care or at the end of life.

Caregiving



The October 2021 release of the first government action plan for caregivers — the *Plan d'action gouvernemental pour les personnes proches aidantes 2021-2026 : Reconnaître pour mieux soutenir* — led to the CREGÉS being entrusted with a new, four-year mandate. In response, we began to develop training for health & social services and community workers on the needs and characteristics of caregivers, the interventions to prioritize and a partnership approach in the context of care and services.

5.2 Contributions to Public Programs and Policies

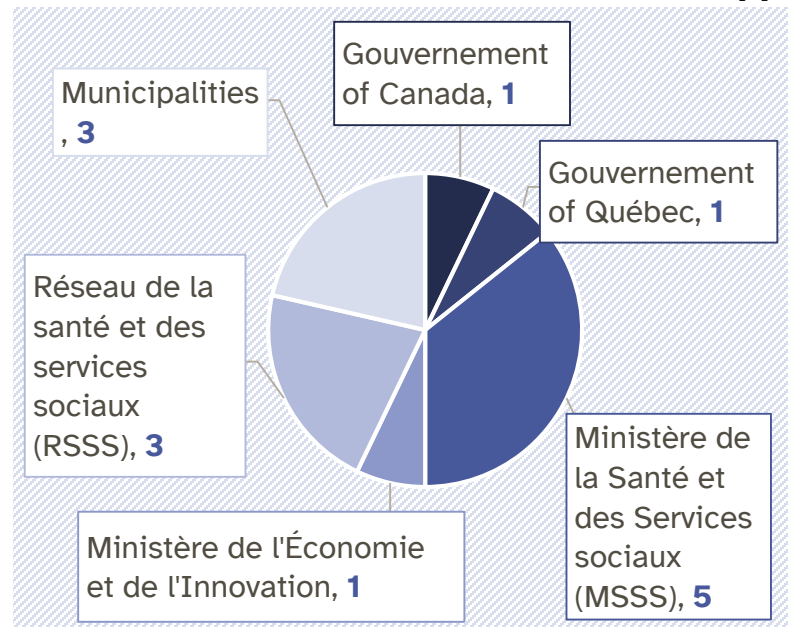

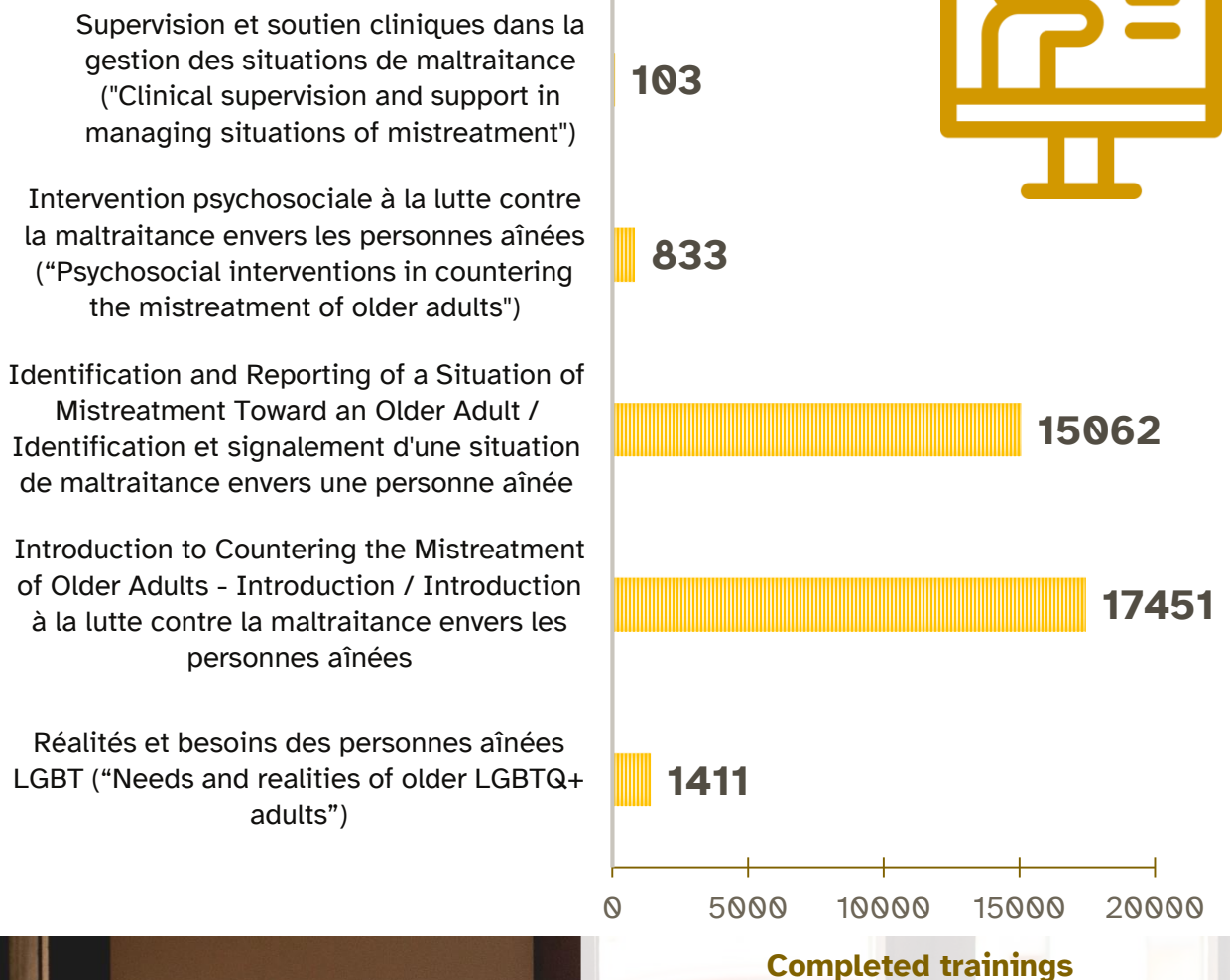

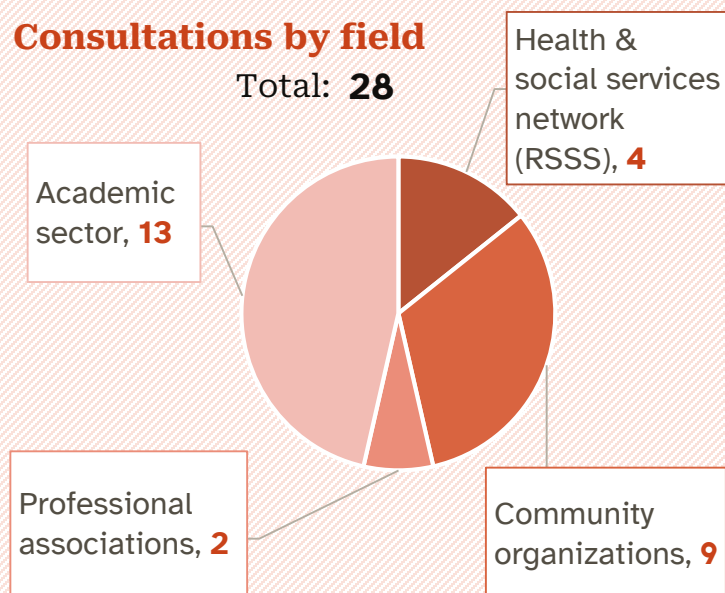
7.1 Expert consultations

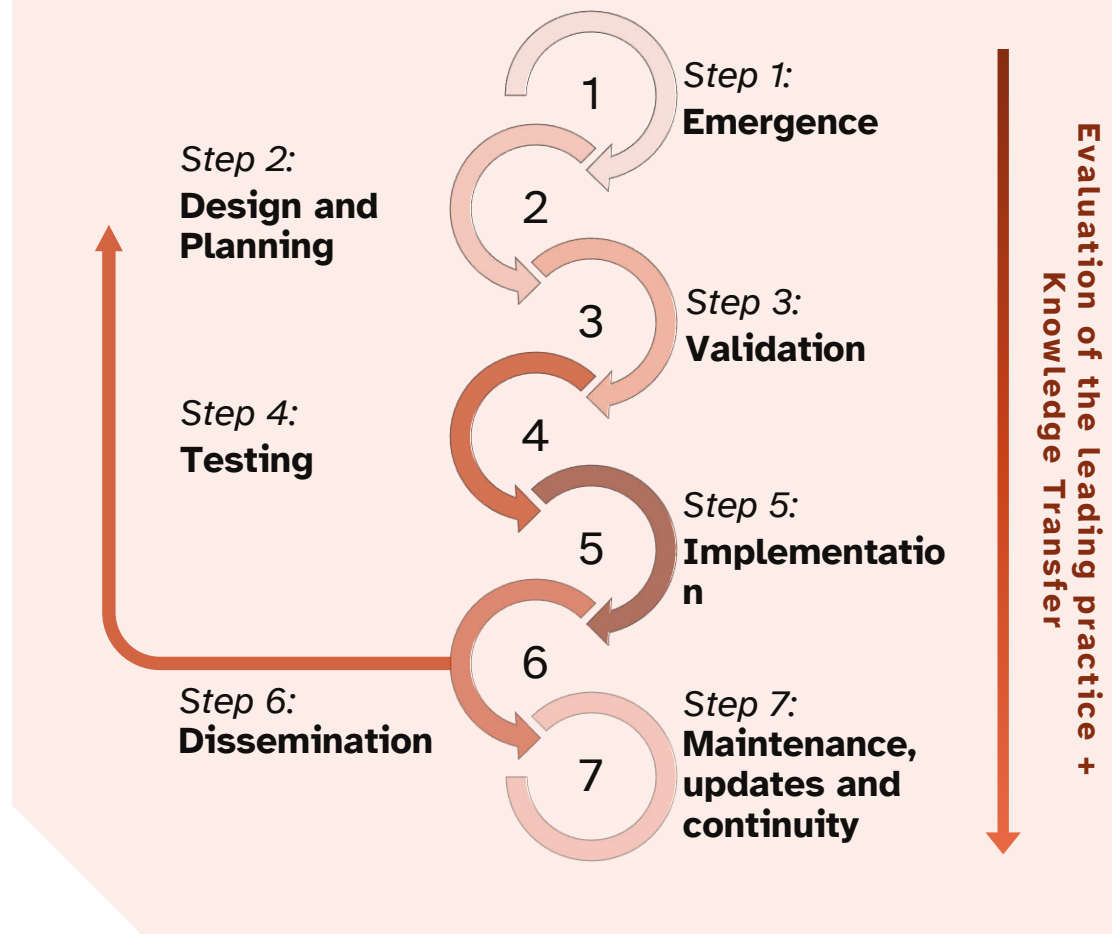
7.1 Innovative & Leading Practices
